1	<p>Clarification on pre-bid queries in Tender No. NS-03</p> <p>The above clarifications were uploaded on the relevant website on 07.12.2015. However, we find that question no. 3 in the document containing clarifications has perhaps not been understood correctly. Reproduced below is the said question submitted by us and the answer given by DMRC:</p> <p>Question: According to this Clause, the Consortium Agreement has to be apostiled or legalised by a Counsellor Officer of the Country from which the document is being issued. Presumably if the Consortium Agreement is executed in India by an Indian Company with a Chinese Company and notarised in India, the same will not require any further legalisation as, in this case, the country of origin of the document shall be India. Similar situation existed in case of Contract CS-08 and the Consortium Agreement notarised in India was accepted. Please confirm.</p> <p>Answer: The documents shall be authenticated by the Embassy/High Commission of India in the country of origin.</p> <p>The clarification sought was regarding authentication of Consortium Agreement entered into in India between an Indian Company and an overseas Company. Since the agreement, as stated above, is entered in to India, the country of origin of the document is India and it is not possible to get the same authenticated by the Embassy / High Commission of India. In identical situation, in case of Tender No. CS-08, the Consortium Agreement entered into in India was accepted by DMRC after authentication by Notary Public in India. We once again request you to kindly confirm that the consortium agreement entered into in India between an Indian Company and an overseas company duly authenticated in India by Notary Public will be acceptable in case of Tender No. NS-03 also as was the case with Tender No. CS-08.</p>	<p>The Consortium Agreement entered in India and executed in India between an Indian Company and an Overseas Company duly authenticated in India by Notary Public is acceptable.</p>
